## JELLO COOKIES

Cream Together:

- ¾ cup shortening (part butter or margarine can be used)
- ½ cup sugar
- 3oz box jello
- 2 eggs
- 1 tsp. vanilla

Add the following ingredients:

- Add 2 ½ cups flour
- 1 tsp. baking powder
- 1 tsp. salt

Blend together well.

Form into balls, roll in a little sugar and flatten with the bottom of a glass. Bake 6-8 minutes in a 400 degree oven.

## FRUGAL LIVING

- For a snack, save the juice from canned fruit. Add a little water and make your own popsicles. The kids love it, its healthier than regular popsicles and you're not throwing the juice down the drain.
- Save big bucks every year by making your own dryer sheets. Pour liquid fabric softener into a clean spray bottle, and spray 4-6 times onto a designated rag. Put the sprayed rag into your dryer with clothes and tumble as usual. Wash the rag every once in a while to remove build-up. A small refill carton of concentrated softener lasts over a year.
- Save the spoonfuls of leftover vegetables in a plastic tub in your freezer. When it is full, its time to make a delicious pot of soup!

- Freeze mushrooms found in the Springtime for year round enjoyment. Take fresh mushrooms, slice in half and soak in salt water overnight. Rinse mushrooms after soaking and roll in flour, lay on cookie sheet, cover and put in freezer. To cook, remove from freezer (Do not let mushrooms thaw before frying or they will become mushy) and fry in oil as usual.
- Polish and protect your furniture by creating your own polish. Mix 1 teaspoon of olive oil and ½ cup of lemon juice. Put mixture in a spray bottle, spray and wipe with a dry cloth.
