## WHAT DOES GRACE CENTER INC. MEAN TO THE PEOPLE OF OUR COMMUNITY?

A little over two years ago, Grace Food Pantry opened its doors to our community. Grace Center INC, committed to helping our neighbors get enough food to meet their needs. Times are tough and sometimes it is hard to make ends meet. Some folks may need our help on a regular basis, while others may need only occasional help from Grace Food Pantry.

Last year food and energy prices jumped the largest amount in 17 years. Combined with the enormous cost of health care and housing, there is a strong need for emergency food assistance. There is also an indication that many people are making choices between food and other necessities. Choices people shouldn't have to make.

In 2008 Grace Food Pantry served 2,895 individuals and distributed 3,478 bags of groceries! In the

first 3 months of 2009 Grace Center has distributed food to 255 households. There is a need for Grace Center Inc.'s services in our community.

Grace Center INC is also dedicated to helping our community to remain socially connected. We sponsor Community Dinners on the last Tuesday of every month except November and December. Those months we have one dinner on the second Tuesday of December. The dinners give friends, family, and neighbors an opportunity to visit as well as have a great meal. Donations are always welcome to help support the Food Pantry. Other Tuesdays, neighbors and friends gather at the Community Center for art classes and Euchre.

When Grace Center opened its doors, we worked with start up grant money to purchase food for the food pantry, rent

the community building, publish this newsletter, sponsor art classes and other activities. Grace Center continues working with other small grants, donations, community partnerships, and township support. We will continue to seek other grant opportunities to support our mission.

In our third year, Grace Center INC remains committed to ensuring that food is always available to those in need. This effort can only be possible with the support of a *generous community* as well as continuing partnerships with Hoosier Hills Food Bank, local churches, schools, community organizations, and businesses. Other partnerships are needed too. We thank our contributors for playing their part because after all, taking the hunger away from those in need is the least we can do.

tion. Trained Lions volunteers and other organizations hosting optical missions in developing countries then distribute the glasses to those in need.
